Part II: Updates

In last month's newsletter I expressed the hope that our two vacant staff positions – Associate Pastor and Director of Music Ministries – might be filled by the start of the new programmatic year, that is to say, in time for Sunday school and choir to start after Labor Day Sunday.

That was perhaps an overly optimistic assessment. It was driven, I think, by my personal experience. It's been a rough stretch since both Joel and Sarah Grace left within the space of a month. The thought of starting this fall with those positions still empty is (if I'm being fully honest) discouraging.

That's the hard news. But there is some good news to share, as well! Although my initial assessment of these searches might have been a little too hopeful, we are making significant progress toward filling both of these positions.

The Music Director Search Team has posted the position on a variety of job-search sites (and on our own website, of course). They have also been working hard to develop a plan for how to conduct the interviews – what questions to ask, how to conduct the audition -- to help insure we hire not just a talented person but the right person. To serve this church.

They hope to begin conducting interviews on August 15th – assuming applications begin to arrive by then.

The Associate Pastor Search Team also continues its work. They have reconfigured the job description somewhat in light of the news of my departure, to better fit with the church's budget moving forward. And they have sent this revised document to the AMT for their review, prior to sending it to Session for theirs. Depending on the outcome of this review process, we could (potentially at least) have a revised job description, ready to post, by the end of this month.

As for the pastoral transition, I also have good news to report. We now have a talented and experienced Transition Team in place to help guide the congregation through this process. The members are: Rodney Lytle, Janice Collins, Dennis Stockdale and Jamie Dale.

Short version: Forward Together!

Pool Party for Hope for Tomorrow

Warren Wilson and Black Mountain United Methodist hosted a pool party on July 12 at Christmount Conference Center for the families at Hope for Tomorrow. All eight moms and thirteen children enjoyed pool time, pizza, and ice cream. The children currently living at Hope for Tomorrow range in age from two to seventeen, and it was especially fun to see all the families playing together in the pool.

Sarah Anne Eller, Corise and Bob Gambrell, and Lynn Deese from BMUMC helped host. Thanks to the Warren Wilson Community Engagement Team for supporting this program, and to BMUMC for covering the cost of a lifeguard.

The Swannanoa Valley Christian Ministry raised funds and constructed the Hope for Tomorrow complex in 2018. Local congregations, including Warren Wilson, and the Kiwanis Club "adopted" the apartments and the adopting groups help re-furbish the apartments when a family moves as well as hosting a yearly event for HFT and providing birthday gifts for the family in their apartment.

Most of the mothers currently at HFT were employed when they sought housing and support in the program, but lost their housing due to rent increase or the fact that they were living with friends and relatives in a very limited space. Hope for Tomorrow provides safe and secure housing, budget counseling, and a case manager who supports the families and helps coordinate other needs.

ASHEVILLE AREA HABITAT'S BUILD SCHEDULE FOR THIS YEAR'S HOUSE OF FAITH

On Tuesday, Aug. 1, Asheville Habitat for Humanity Executive Director Andy Barnett presented the plans for construction of this year's House of Faith.

Work will begin in early September on the two-family, two bedroom townhome unit in Habitat's newest neighborhood, Glenn Bridge, in Arden near Brevard Rd. This will be one of the early dwellings on the 8 acre site where Habitat, with volunteer help, will eventually construct 29 affordable homes for qualified buyers.

Last year 14 Warren Wilson church members and friends volunteered a day or a half day to help build the House of Faith in West Asheville. This year volunteers will be needed in September, October and November. If you volunteered last year Larry Griswold will be intouch with you.
