Join us at the Presbyterian Women's Spring Gathering on April 20, 2024 in Upper Anderson Auditorium at Montreat. Registration and brunch begin at 9:00 AM and the meeting begins at 10:00. Our theme is Celebrating Presbyterian Women. The speaker, Nancy Midgette, is a research historian at the Presbyterian Heritage Center, and we will learn about Hallie Paxson Winsborough, considered the founder of the Women's Auxiliary in the PCUS. We will award a Faith Fund Grant, award a PW scholarship, hear from the Microloan Task Force, and honor women who entered the Church Triumphant in 2023. The offering goes to the Presbyterian Disaster Agency. Our PW historian, Teresa Carpenter, is compiling a Powerpoint presentation from the PW groups who sent histories to her to celebrate what PW is doing today. Lunch is in Assembly Inn, and the Heritage Center will be open for tours after lunch.

# **JEFF KEITH PRESENTATION**

On Sunday, April 14, following our service we will host distinguished Warren Wilson faculty member Dr. Jeffrey Keith for a lunch presentation to kick off our Mission Study. Jeff has done extensive research on the history of this church, and the college, which he will share as part of his presentation.

#### "Seven Origin Stories in a Sentence: Reflections on Warren Wilson College's 130-Year History"

In this discussion, Dr. Jeff Keith—a professor in the Department of Global Studies and History at Warren Wilson College —will discuss some of the complexities hidden within a conventional one-sentence "origin story" for Warren Wilson College. The lecture is informed by Dr. Keith's research into the history of the college in the context of the Swannanoa Valley.

Dr. Keith is currently writing the first of three volumes of a "People's History of Warren Wilson College." The three-volume "people's history" will explore the College's past through the lenses of environmental, cultural, and social historical conventions, respectively. The first book — "The Valley Remembers" — will tell some of the deepest known stories of the Swannanoa Valley in the context of the college's history of learning from its setting.

Dr. Keith's work is funded by The Council of Independent Colleges' program known as the Network for Vocation in Undergraduate Education (NetVUE), which is funded by the Lily Endowment. NetVUE awarded Warren Wilson College a Grant for Reframing the Institutional Saga in 2021, and Dr. Keith has been working on this project since that time.

### PRESBYTERY GRANTS \$30,000 TO HOMEWARD BOUND HOUSING PROJECT

Like Warren Wilson Presbyterian Church, the Presbytery of Western North Carolina has pledged to guide its activities by Jesus's injunction in Matthew 25 to serve "the least of these brothers and sisters of mine." As part of its commitment as a Matthew 25 presbytery, our presbytery recently made a significant contribution to the affordable housing needs in the western part of the state. Using \$200,000 of the money derived from the sale of the property of closed churches, the presbytery recently approved grants to eight projects that support affordable projects from Lincolnton and Rutherfordton to Sylva and Banner Elk.

Two of the grants supported affordable housing projects in Asheville. One grant provided \$30,000 for Homeward Bound's Compass Point Village. The other gave \$25,000 to Beloved Asheville for the Beloved Village of Tiny Homes.

Continuing its longtime partnership with Homeward Bound, Warren Wilson Presbyterian Church joined Montreat Presbyterian Church and First Church Asheville as endorsing congregations for the Compass Point Village application. On Friday, March 22, Sally Broughton went with Keith Grogg from Montreat to present the check to Jim Lowder, major gifts officer at Homeward Bound (see picture). They received a tour of the facility with its 85 permanent supportive housing units; Homeward Bound estimates that the facility will reduce unsheltered homelessness in our community by 49%.

The other projects supported by the presbytery's housing grants will have similar impact throughout western North Carolina. We can all rejoice at this illustration of how much more we can accomplish as we work together in the larger church of which we are a part.
