


A Note from Laurie

Lent is a time to allow a fresh new taste of God!



Dr. Jack Allison served as a Peace Corps Volunteer in Malawi, Africa, 1967-69. His public health education was punctuated by many original songs and jingles which became quite popular with Malawians throughout the country.

Jack has had a distinguished career in academic emergency medicine, with an emphasis on public health, acting as Chair and Medical Director of Emergency Medicine programs in Charleston, and the Brody School of Medicine at ECU. He founded the Depart. of Emergency Medicine at ECU-SOM in 1980. Dr. Allison became the second endowed Chair of Emergency Medicine internationally.

Additionally, Dr. Allison responded to the earthquake in Haiti in January 2010 by treating hundreds of quake victims. In February 2012, he volunteered in Kenya and Somalia where he

provided both emergency care and public health education to hundreds of Somali refugees; then in October, he volunteered in Zambia where he helped to install 112 shallow water wells. Since 2017, Jack has been a senior consultant to the Fulbright Association's WASH project in Malawi.

Allison's avocation is singing and songwriting. He has written over 150 songs and jingles. Since 1967, he has raised \$170,000 with his music, and he and his wife, Sue Wilson, have given away all of those monies to various charitable organizations, including \$30,000 to help feed Malawian AIDS orphans.

BFWARE

Every now and then our church's contact information, especially the pastors' e-mail addresses, have been used to try and scam congregants and friends of the church. Most of the attempts that church leadership are aware of involve e-mails or texts that seem to be from the pastor asking for help buying gift cards. In addition to being the place where you can file a claim, the website also has tips for spotting scams.

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

HABITAT HOUSE OF FAITH #4 MOMENT FOR MISSION WILL BE ON MARCH 30

Though Hurricane Helene adversely affected Asheville Area Habitat for Humanity in many ways and cancelled our Moment for Mission last September, considerable progress has been made since then and our Moment for Mission is now scheduled for Sunday, March 30.

Wayne Thomas, future owner of House of Faith #4, now being built by a coalition of faith communities including ours, will join us for the Moment for Mission at the start of our worship service.

Like House of Faith #3, which several church members helped build with donations and work at the job site last year, House of Faith #4 is being built in Arden's Glenn Bridge neighborhood. It is a single-story townhome with closing anticipated in June or July.

The faith communities that help build each House of Faith also donate money to help buy materials and we will receive a special offering for this purpose on March 30. A donation of any size will help, so please consider making one. If you prefer to make a donation before then, here are options for that:

- 1) Through our Church web site (click Give Online button top right corner)
- 2) By check mailed to the Church Office 101 Chapel Lane, Swannanoa, NC 28778, or dropped in an offering plate inside the front door of the sanctuary with <u>Habitat offering</u> written on the memo line.
- 3) By a Qualified Charitable Distribution from an IRA or check from a Donor Advised Gift Fund to the Church with the designation <u>Habitat offering</u> included.

A Transitional Housing Program of Swannanoa Valley Christian Ministry

MISSION: To create a community where each single mom and her children have access to safe, supportive, and sustainable housing, empowering them to achieve independence and thrive in all aspects of life.

OBJECTIVE: To empower housing insecure single moms and children to live independently by providing low-cost temporary transitional housing, community, case management, and empowering programs such as life skill classes, counseling, spiritual enrichment, and financial coaching.

PRIORITY: Given to those who live, work, or have children attending school/preschool in the Swannanoa Valley area.

- · Single Mom facing housing insecurity.
- · 1-2 children under the age of 19 (still in high school), living with you.
- · Means of transportation such as car or bus system.
- · Employed or employable.
- · Complete pre-screening with Case Manager or Program Director.

(Examples of eligible applicants: Women who have just gotten a job and need some time to save; women who are ready for housing but are on a waiting list, women who are working but earning less than enough for suitable housing.)

We C annot Accommodate:

- · Moderate to severe mental illness.
- substance abuse issues with less than 1 year recovery and sponsor.
- · acute domestic violence concerns.
- · history of violent or threatening behavior.
- · Current domestic relationships.
- · Moms with responsibility for friends or other family members.
- Need for aid with daily living (physical, medical, mobility, mental health).


