SVCM

Swananoa Valley Christian Ministry has been a fixture in our community for a long time. Most of you have heard of them, worked with them, been served by them, or prayed for them. During what has been a period of unbelieveable trauma for so much of this area, they have stepped up. Please take time to visit their website, www.svcmblackmountain.org and click on the link to read their latest newsletter. There is far too much valuable information than we can fit on this page. Instead we will share part of what Assistant Director Savanna Craig had to say:



"Talking about "the flood" feels like speaking a four-letter word at this point, or in this case, a five-letter word, but it's impossible to reflect on the past year of the life of Swannanoa Valley Christian Ministry without mentioning Hurricane Helene.

"We all have a Helene story. The day after my own home flooded, I remember thinking "I have to get to SVCM." It was an urgent and pressing need in my soul. I knew that there was both work for me to do and care for me to receive there and that somehow, I would find solace in existing in that in-between space. So much about those days felt like living in a flux between two realities.

"Time felt like it moved simultaneously so fast and so slow. Memories of those days are hazy and jumbled with moments of intense clarity too. For those of us working at SVCM, or with other relief efforts, we are still living in the reality of our own traumatic personal experiences while also stepping outside of ourselves to do the work that is required of us in our community. Categories and boxes for the way we have understood the world suddenly don't fit anymore.



"Scripture tells us that "the Spirit intercedes for us in our wordless groans" (Romans 8:26). I have to believe that also means the Spirit is present to our curses, our deep sighs, our screams, our cries, and our empty silence. When our expressions of grief are bigger and more complicated than we can understand and our own meaning-making and self-interpretation fails, the Spirit makes sense of it all in ways we cannot.

"In times of a community crisis, we come to the end of individuality. Our only choice for moving forward to healing is togetherness. In those moments, there is no more separation between us and them. There is only we. With the help of the Spirit, we make meaning by patching our stories together with the stories of the people around us.

"I have always been pleased by the empathy and love that SVCM pours into our community, but now, our staff and volunteers are able to identify with and understand the clients of SVCM on a level that we would never have access to had we not experienced the hardship of Helene together. I pray every day that we never forget and that our experience will stay deep in our bones as long as we exist.

"In the meantime, we yell, weep, sigh, and work hand-in-hand with our neighbors all held in the arms of the Spirit who just knows."

Nevertheless, the review team believes that it is valuable to engage all staff members in this process. Several years ago, the Session voted to conduct the review in the spring at the end of our normal program year. To complete its work, the team needs input from the entire congregation.

The following questions may help individuals prepare their responses, but please do not feel limited by them:

- 1. What staff members' work have you noted over the last year?
- 2. For each staff member you identify:
 - In what ways has the staff member assisted our ministry?
 - What strengths did he or she display in their work?
 - Can you suggest any ways in which the individual's support for our ministry might be enhanced?

The team would like everyone's insights regarding what the staff has done well and how the church can improve. The team will also appreciate your general observations about our church – what is going well, what concerns do you have.

Alternatively, you may email your response to jstorey57@gmail.com. The team will keep your observations in confidence, but it does ask you to sign your comments. Anonymous comments are very difficult to evaluate.

If possible, please submit your responses to the team before the end of May so it can complete its report for the Session in a timely manner. The team appreciates your assistance in this most important process.
